COVID has certainly impacted the students we are privileged to support. In spite of CPS going virtual, the various schools have been providing drive up and/or deliveries of school supplies to the students. Fortunately, we were able to meet those needs this fall much to the relief of school principals and the parents of the children.

Most of you are well aware that much of the aid we provide to CPS and Harvey Schools goes to the most impoverished areas. What we have learned is that the loss of jobs for a good number of people has resulted in a dependence upon others for food. This past fall we have provided each of 85 families with \$100 Aldi and Jewel gift cards along with an assortment of Walmart and Target gift cards.

Aside from providing school supplies and food to those we assist, Schools Count has also been able to get some needed warm winter coats to the children. Due to your generosity we were also able to provide needed supplies to the Louisiana South Cameron High School students as their school was nearly destroyed due to two devastating hurricanes this summer.

Just as we have to 'weather the storm' with respect to COVID so too must we persist with regard to providing support to the various schools. The needs of students aren't met all at once. If we want children to be successful then a long term commitment is an imperative.
